### **081. MINUTES**

The Minutes of the previous Remote Meeting of the Parish Council on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2020 had been circulated and read. Cllr Adams proposed and Cllr Holmes seconded that the minutes be accepted. Planning site minutes from September 2020 were also read and approved. All were in agreement that the PC meeting minutes and Planning site minutes should be signed as a true record.

### **082. MATTERS ARISING**

#### **(a) Recycling Officer**

Jane Savage gave a presentation on the new service which will be fully in place by March 2021. The collection date has changed for many parishes but remains the same for Stoke Fleming. There is a demand to recycle more in order to meet the Climate Change target. The current recycling rate sits at 57% of all waste. All plastic sacks will soon be replaced with lidded boxes instead, in line with the other Devon authorities. Twelve new recycling vehicles have been commissioned to carry out the new service together with a new depot at Ivybridge. It was stated that bottle banks may be rationalised in time but there are no plans at present to get rid of them.

**085. COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT**

Cllr Brazil confirmed that there are still very few Covid cases across Devon apart from Exeter, demonstrating an effective track and trace system.

Children's Services received an "Inadequate" rating, and a new Head of Service will be recruited shortly.

Cllr Brazil also confirmed that there is a fund for potholes so welcomes any ideas from the PC.

**086. DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT**

Cllr Reeve confirmed that the Development Committee had met on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> October to discuss the Parish Council's objections to an application by Stagecoach for a permanent depot at the junction of Venn Lane and the A3122. Following a lengthy discussion, including representations from the Parish Council the application was refused. There will now be discussions aimed at establishing a timescale for them to vacate the site and search for a new one. Various other suggestions have been put forward to Stagecoach in previous months.

The swimming pool at Dartmouth will reopen on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> October with changing rooms to be opened and the swim school to restart soon as well.

**088. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

**(a) Sub-committee report**

The latest report on the planned improvements to the Bird Walk has been circulated to all Councillors. £20,000 in Section106 funding, resulting from the development at Windward will be utilised.

Confirmation has been received of £1,000 from Cllr Brazil's locality fund and £500 from Cllr Reeve's fund. The Public Rights of Way department at DCC has also committed £4,000 to the fund. The intention is for work to commence on November 30, lasting approximately three weeks.

There should be some funds in reserve which means that electrical ducting can be installed for possible lighting at a later date. The Bird Walk will have to be closed while resurfacing takes place and there will be diversions in place.

**089. COMMUNITY**

**(a) BT Payphone**

SHDC have now notified Ofcom and BT with regards the various payphones across the district and have decided to support the PC's objection to the removal of the one in Dartmouth Road, Stoke Fleming.

**090. ROADS & TRANSPORT**

At the request of the Parish Council, and in order to deal with the problem of speeding on the northern approaches to the village, Highways have now ordered a SCARF (Speed Compliance Action Review Forum survey) and report which will then carry out speeding tests in the village to ascertain whether a vehicle activated sign (VAS) is required.

**091. MAINTENANCE**

**(a) Pavilion toilets**

The toilets are currently still closed and the Maintenance team will consider the implication of the cost of cleaning and, in the light of recent vandalism, of arranging for them to be opened and closed at the beginning and end of each day. A decision will then be taken on reopening them.

**(b) Bus shelters**

Cllr Harris will meet with the contractor for the bus shelter cleaning to consider other works that need to be carried out.

The Clerk will ask the contractor to tidy up Ron's Corner along with other overgrown areas in the playpark.

Cllr Harris received permission to cut back the chestnut tree against Venn Lane in order to access the hedge for maintenance works.

**092. PLANNING:**

**(a) Baker Estates – Land off Townstal Road**

Councillors met developer Baker Estates on the Cotton site on 29<sup>th</sup> September and a report was circulated. Foundations for the first phase of housing, comprising 65 homes, of which 30 will be affordable units, will open in April and the roundabout and access roads will be built shortly.

The PC needs to put forward proposals for street name ideas at the site in response to those put forward by the developer. The Clerk will circulate the email to all Councillors to review.

Concern was expressed over the Blue Cedar development site on School Road, where work was discontinued at the start of the lockdown in March. The Clerk will get in touch with the developers to find out if and when they are due to restart works on site.

Cllr Holmes confirmed that councillors supported the new Health Centre planning application revisions but including a statement over the number of trees to be felled and the effect on the proposed bat corridor.
