Robust assessment system supports staff in identifying areas of strength and areas for development at all levels to ensure the very best outcomes for pupils.

Marking and feedback is integral to ongoing assessment for pupils and staff and leads to good progress.

The effectiveness of Early Years

All EYFS Staff have the knowledge, understanding and pedagogy to deliver outstanding EYFS provision.

Key and focused intervention supports pupil's speech and language at the earliest possible stage.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment.

Teachers provide pupils with incisive feedback, in line with the school's assessment policy, about what pupils can do to improve their knowledge, understanding and skills. The pupils use this feedback effectively.

Teachers embed reading, writing and communication and, where appropriate, mathematics exceptionally well across the curriculum, equipping all pupils with the necessary skills to make outstanding progress. There is a clear focus to enable exceptional progress of all pupils particularly, SEN, Disadvantaged and the More Able.

Effectiveness of leadership and management

Leaders and governors focus on consistently improving outcomes for all pupils, but especially for disadvantaged pupils. They are uncompromising in their ambition.

Governors systematically challenge senior leaders so that the effective deployment of staff and resources, including the pupil premium and SEN funding, secures excellent outcomes
