## 89. FUNDRAISING AND VOLUNTEERING sub-committee report

a) Future use of pavilion

i. Review pavilion for suitability for other uses. Commercial rental of the pavilion could be a possibility, but intention is sports facility. Remove from November agenda.

ii. Solar Panels update – Three different contractors looked at Village Hall, along with the pavilion which should fit 4 panels, and should lower cost of utilities. Cost possibly  $\pounds$ 4,000. Should raise profile of pavilion. Project may be eligible for SHDC funding.
